

OLDBURY PARK PRIMARY SCHOOL – PE Funding

For the academic year 2016-2017, the government has again committed to extra funding, specifically to develop and improve the provision of Physical Education (PE) and Sport in Primary Schools. The funding has been provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport and is ring-fenced and solely and specifically for the provision of PE and School Sport.

Schools are expected to use the money in a variety of ways that will result in a significant impact being made on the quality and variety of provision available to the children. Spending should ensure that the quality of provision is also sustainable – by improving the level of teaching, or by improving the facilities and equipment available. PE and Sport should be at the heart of school life and achievement should be raised in these areas. Each school is free to choose the ways in which they spend their money, to enable the individual school to identify where their needs lie.

Funding is based on a single sum (given to all schools) and an additional amount per child. This means that we will receive approximately £10,000 for the upcoming academic year.

Outlined below are the broad areas of development that we have chosen to focus on for this academic year:

- Outreach projects – enabling children to access high quality facilities that we do not have in school. These should inspire future participation. **£4000-£5000**
- Additional class coaching/teacher CPD – each class to be supported by a high quality outside coach/teacher for one half-term block of lessons. This should help to support teacher development, inspire the children and also equip children for upcoming cluster and county festivals. **£2500-£3000**
- Equipment purchase – ongoing upgrade of PE equipment to enable the delivery of high quality PE lessons and a wide range of clubs. Kit targeted for upgrade includes – netball, basketball, hockey, dodgeball, tennis and athletics. In addition, the lunchtime ‘Huff and Puff’ sheds to receive considerable re-stock. **£2000**
- Swimming – to ensure that all Y4 children can access swimming teaching, including those with disabilities. **£350**
- Visit of a professional basketball player – arrange for a Worcester Wolves player to visit the school and run an inspiring Masterclass and taster session for KS2 pupils. **£250**
- Competition days – outside provider to organise events to enable children to access competitive school sports. **£1000**
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Total expected expenditure £10,100 - £11,600
