As you may be aware, it was World Mental Health Day this week. At Oldbury Park, part of our whole school ethos is to promote and improve children's mental health and wellbeing. We marked the day with an assembly in each key stage, where we talked about what the term mental health means, what can affect it and how we can take steps improve it. We talked about how feelings of sadness, loneliness, worry or anger are perfectly normal. But, being able to bounce back and recover from them is really important. We labelled this Mental Resilience.

We discussed the many ways in which we can improve our mental health, such as: taking time to chill-out and relax, spending time with family or friends, taking part in physical activity, spending less time on a screen, getting a good night's sleep and sharing a problem or worry with someone. We also talked about how being kind and supportive towards our peers can really help create feelings of happiness, contentment and well-being in others.
