Now that the children have settled into their new classes, we request that you say goodbye to your child where the staff are standing with books and give any messages to these staff, allowing your child to walk into school independently. Many thanks for your co-operation with this.

#### Magistrates visit to Year 6

On Monday afternoon, the children in Year 6 were lucky enough to be visited by two local magistrates, Mrs Hulland and Mr Knight, a former head teacher!

The children were surprised to hear that magistrates do not need qualifications and that they are volunteers and, therefore, don't get paid. The children learnt that 95% of all court cases are dealt with by the magistrates and that only the most serious cases go before a judge in the Crown Court.

They found out that punishments handed down are dependent on a person's criminal history and their ability to pay a fine. Very wealthy people who commit serious crimes are liable to a very heavy fine!

The children asked many interesting questions and were shocked to learn that from 10 years old a child is considered criminally liable and, as a result, can end up in court, in front of the magistrates.

Year 6 thanked Mrs Hulland and Mr Knight and were very grateful for an interesting experience.





#### Wonderful Worcestershire Week

Over the course of this week, the staff and children at Oldbury Park have had lots of fun focusing on Art, DT, History and Music through the theme of 'Wonderful Worcestershire'. It has been a very busy week with all year groups taking part in learning about our county and what makes it special.

In **Art**, some children have been looking at patterns, prints and landscapes, using Royal Worcester Porcelain and the Malvern Hills for inspiration.

In **Music**, many of the Year Groups have looked at the work of Edward Elgar, listening to his famous pieces. Children have enjoyed creating dances and composing their own music too.

In **History**, some children have been discovering how Worcestershire has changed over time and have learnt about a number of key historical events that have happened here.

In **DT**, children have been researching, designing and making items inspired by the county and its fantastic produce.
