

## Early Help Offer

The Early Help Offer is an approach, rather than a service. It respects every family's right to access information to help manage their own lives successfully, whilst guiding them to seek support from appropriate sources. Help can then be agreed as soon as concerns start to emerge. The 'Offer' is for all children, as issues may arise at any point in a child or young person's life. It includes both universal and targeted /specialist services, to reduce or prevent concerns from growing or becoming entrenched. All our Early Help is offered in partnership with parents and carers.

Providing early help to our children and families at Oldbury Park Primary School means we are more effective in promoting support as soon as we can. Early help means providing support as soon as a problem emerges, at any point in a child's life, beginning with foundation stage. We endeavour to create a school ethos that promotes trust between all adults and children, so that all children know who they are able to talk to if they have any concerns or worries.

Within school we provide the following early help support for all children, striving to ensure concerns, no matter how small, are listened to and supported effectively:

Safeguarding	Oldbury Park School believes safeguarding is everyone's responsibility. All adults in school receive regular statutory update training. The Designated Safeguarding Lead (Mrs Boyce) and Deputy Designated Safeguarding Leads (Mr Burnage and Ms Hall) have received specialist training on Child Sexual Exploitation, Prevent, Extremism and Female Genital Mutilation.

Curriculum	PSHE Programme: Our school delivers comprehensive Personal, Social, Health and Economics, (PSHE) and Relationship and Sex Education (RSE) programmes. These further support the children's understanding of how to keep themselves safe. It also broadens their understanding of strategies to develop their resilience, as well as their awareness of their mental health and approaches to keep this aspect of their lives healthy.	
On-line safety	Stand-alone units on Internet Safety are taught across the whole school and reinforced throughout the computing curriculum. We hold at least one assembly each term on Internet Safety. We include regular updates in our weekly newsletter, responding to concerns raised by pupils, parents and staff. Mr Burnage is the school's E-safety co- ordinator and has attended specialist training in this area.	
Action for Learning	This is a physical activity intervention targeted at children to help improve confidence, self-esteem, communication and relationship skills. The groups or 1:1 sessions are run by specialist PE TAs employed by school.
