### Year 5 Cricket Tournament

Tuesday 21<sup>st</sup> May saw Year 5 head to the annual cricket tournament at Ombersley Cricket Club. A mixed team of ten children attended the day; many of the children had very little experience of playing cricket at a competitive level. A total of seven teams attended the tournament and were split into two groups. One group of four and one of three. We found ourselves in a group with St Barnabas and Cherry Orchard. In our first match, Oldbury faced St Barnabas. A great all-round performance (the first as a team) from the children led to a close finish with Oldbury just losing out. With that, Oldbury knew that they had to win the final match to reach the semi-final. Oldbury elected to bowl first and managed to restrict Cherry Orchard to a low total with some excellent teamwork in the field. This then opened up the opportunity for Oldbury to go out and win it with their batting. The batting pairs constructed some solid partnerships and put together a great total helping us to come out on top.

The victory against Cherry Orchard then meant that we finished second in our group. This meant a face-off against Cranham in the semi-final (the winners of their group). Despite the lack of cricketing experience, the children showed fantastic ability and pulled together in a very competitive match. After a great batting display, it all came down to the bowling. The fielding was excellent again and the children took a number of key catches. By the final two overs, Oldbury were losing by eight runs. Two quick wickets resulted in Oldbury going back into the lead by two runs. In the final over, the children were very unfortunate and a number of sliced shots managed to creep through the fielders resulting to the concession of five runs. The very last ball almost led to a wicket but narrowly missed. A very tense match which sadly ended in a narrow loss. Even though the children were disappointed, I was so impressed with the attitude shown by all ten children and they represented the school in an exemplary fashion. Well done to all involved.
