Magistrates Visit to Year 6

On Tuesday afternoon, the children in Year 6 were visited by Mrs Hulland, a local Magistrate. She talked to the children about the legal system in our country and explained the differences between a Crown Court and a Magistrate Court. The children learnt that a Magistrate can impose a fine or send people to jail and they were surprised that anybody can become a Magistrate from the age of 18 until the day of their 70th birthday, as they do not need any legal training. The children were then presented with different scenarios where a crime had been committed and were asked to think about who the victims were and the impact that crime would have on them. All of the children found the talk very interesting and they learnt a lot about the legal system. The Year 6 Team.

Year 4 WOW Day

Year 4 had their own Anglo Saxon experience out in the outdoor learning area. This was based on our Anglo Saxon topic for this half term. The children had to find one of the seven Anglo Saxon kingdoms and form their kingdom. The Mercia kingdom was very organised, with King Luke, Florrie, Kelsey, Darcie, Alfie and Huw who all began building their thatched house and fire straight away. Wessex (King Linden), Essex (King Riley),

Northumbria (King James), Sussex (King Luke H), Kent (King Daniel) and East Anglia (King Cody) were also a very effective team.

The kingdom of Wessex held peace talks with King Riley of Essex and, luckily, they came to an amicable agreement and Wessex agreed to pay a pig tax of three pigs a year to be allowed to farm more lands. Boundaries across all kingdoms were re-affirmed - without serious loss of life!

RSPB Visit for Year 5

On Tuesday, Year 5 were visited by two members of the RSPB, who came to talk to us about birds, linking with our topic Outside Our Window. We found out about different species of birds, what they eat, where they live and all sorts of other fascinating facts. Year 5 listened very well and asked lots of interesting questions. We all finished the morning having learned something we didn't know before. Here are some examples: "Birds lose weight overnight." (Mrs Tudge)

"Magpies are great predators."

"If birds don't wash, they can't fly as well." (Olivia)

"Baby birds can fly by a maximum of three weeks old." (Freyja)

The school was then given five beautiful books about birds and all of the children were given an RSPB magazine to enjoy. We would like to thank Patrick and Margaret for giving up their time to come into school and giving us such an interesting talk.

Year 6 WOW Day

Yesterday, Year 6 had a fantastic day learning more about South America as part of our Roaming Wild topic. To start the day, we hunted around the field to find facts about South America. Each question also had a photo of a location around the field which they had to find to discover the answer!

After break, we ventured into forest school, where the children became lost explorers! They worked exceptionally well in teams to build dens and living areas as if they were lost in the forest.

In the afternoon, we started to learn about the festival called 'The Day of the Dead' which is widely celebrated across South America to celebrate deceased loved ones. The festival is a massive celebration of a person's life, celebrated with flowers, food, colour and music.

The children designed their own masks and made paper decorations like they do in South America.
