What is Bullying?

Bullying is when someone is hurt by words or actions, on purpose and repeatedly. It can also be when a group of children pick on another child or other children.

Bullying is not:

- An accident.
- Falling out with friends.
- Something that only happens once.

Bullying can be:

Emotional – when someone's feelings are hurt by:

- Saying or doing unkind things
- Making things up about someone that are not true
- Whispering things to other children about someone else
- Making fun of someone else
- Leaving someone out from a group.

Physical – when someone is hurt by:

- Punching, pushing, kicking, hitting, spitting, pinching, biting, scratching or threatening.

Online (Cyber-bullying) – when something is written about someone else or someone makes fun of them online in:

- Text messages, chats, comments, emails, photos or videos.
