#### Some facts about the Royal Society of Arts:

- 1. The RSA was founded in 1754 but only moved into RSA House in London in 1774. Before this, Fellows would regularly meet in coffee houses around London. However as the membership grew, meetings became rowdier and rowdier, even causing the floor to collapse in one.
- 2. Robert Adams actually ran out of money when building RSA House, and so to raise more funds, he created a lottery scheme, but never handed out any rewards! A copy of the lottery tickets are on display at RSA House.
- 3. RSA was one of the first organisations to allow female members, even giving them equal voting rights to men. This was a direct mandate from our founder, William Shipley.
- 4. The Fellows (past and present) have been involved in a number of life-changing projects from implementing public toilets around London (Charles Dickens) to designing the iPhone (Jonny Ives).
- 5. Famous Fellows include: Karl Marx, Adam Smith, Benjamin Franklin, Thomas Edison, Alexander Graham Bell, Marie Curie, Charles Dickens, Stephen Hawking, Nelson Mandela, Thomas Edison, Tim Berners-Lee, David Attenborough, Mary Wollstonecraft, Vivienne Westwood, Bob Dylan, Prue Leith.
- 6. Fellowship currently stands at around 30,000. There are Fellows all over the world, but over 90% are UK residents.

#### Year 6 Visit to The Hive

On Wednesday 22<sup>nd</sup> January, Year 6 will be visiting The Hive to conduct some research into our topic based around the Victorians. We will be at the Hive for most of the day and will return to school by 3:15pm. Please ensure that your child has a packed lunch and plenty to drink. We would also like the children to bring a warm and waterproof coat in case of bad weather.

#### Year 4 'Changes' WOW Experiences

We began our introduction to Solids, Gases and Liquids with a trip to Forest School. Miss Doughty made a fire for us and we began our adventure of 'Changes' by having a debate on why Popcorn 'pops!' and a kettle boils producing steam. We used the correct scientific vocabulary to describe the processes to each other and used the heat of the fire to make popcorn and hot water.

We continued our adventure by becoming scientists the next day and building on what we had found out at Forest School. What a day we all had! We were all dressed as budding scientists and carried out 10 different experiments throughout the morning as part of our Changes Topic, revolving around Solids, Liquids and Gases.

We began with our predictions for each experiment, culminating in an afternoon of sharing our results and discussing the individual experiments with our year group. We did have some quite varied results! Daniel B explained how the different types of sponges absorb different amounts of water due to the fact that the hole sizes were different and that the liquid took up the space of the holes. Riley was able to describe how gases behave through using bicarbonate of soda, a balloon and vinegar. He told us how the particles change their behaviour as they change from a solid to a liquid to form a gas. Do you know which gas? Ask the pupils, they will know!

The children also made plastic with PVA glue and soda crystals. They had to add enough saturated solution until no more solid would dissolve. They had to use their perseverance skills as they had to mix continuously so the glue would absorb the soda solution. It did become a solid and as Darcy noticed was 'bouncy'. It could be handles and moulded.

We had great discussions about the experiments that did not quite go to plan, and the children used this opportunity to express themselves using scientific language. Jessica said the condensation on the window made it opaque! This is very true. Chase told us that the steam from the kettle evaporates to form moisture in the air. A fabulous day of learning was had by the whole year group. Thank you for your support with their brilliant outfits.
