At the end of the session the children asked some good questions and learnt a traditional song in Zulu, called Siyahamba. We are very grateful to Mrs Jordan for giving her time to help the children with their learning.

Young Voices 2020


After months of hard work and rehearsals, Key Stage 2 were very excited to attend Young Voices at Resorts World Arena in Birmingham on Tuesday.
