Additional tasks for this week (04/5/20)

Our topic this half term is 'Once Upon a Time'. This week we will be using the story The Three Billy Goats Gruff. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=3QzT1sq6kCY

Choose at least one of the activities below and have a go.

Expressive Art and Design- Make a troll. It could be a drawing, a collage, a painting or something entirely different. Be as creative as

you wish! You could have a go at creating a symmetrical pattern using paint (see blotto troll example below).

Physical Development- Find different ways to move and travel around your house or garden. Can you do tiny little footsteps on tip

toes for the littlest billy goat? Medium sized steps for the middle sized billy goat? Large steps for the biggest billy goat? Stomping knee high steps for the troll? You could even make a starting and finishing point somewhere and count how many steps each character takes to get from start to finish. Which character would take the most steps? Which would take the least?

Literacy- You could create a wanted poster for the troll or have a think about what each Billy Goat might say and write your idea in the speech bubbles below.

Speaking/Self Confidence and Awareness- Use the story map provided to practise retelling the story yourself. Try using different voices to pretend you are the different characters from the story.






