Have a go at writing some of these 'ear' words.



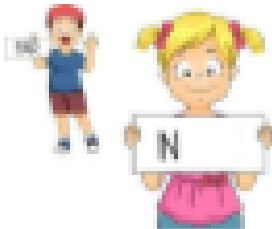

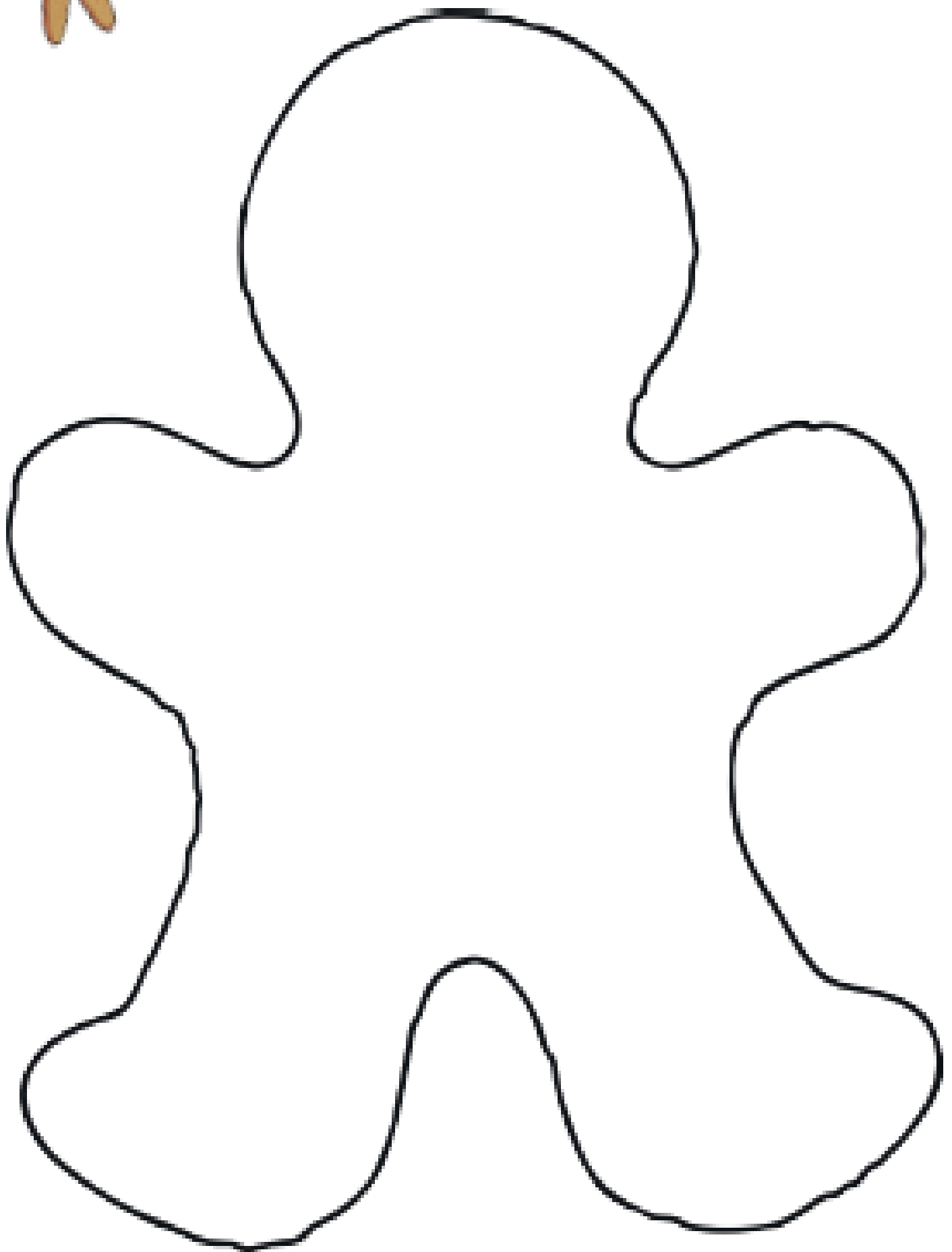


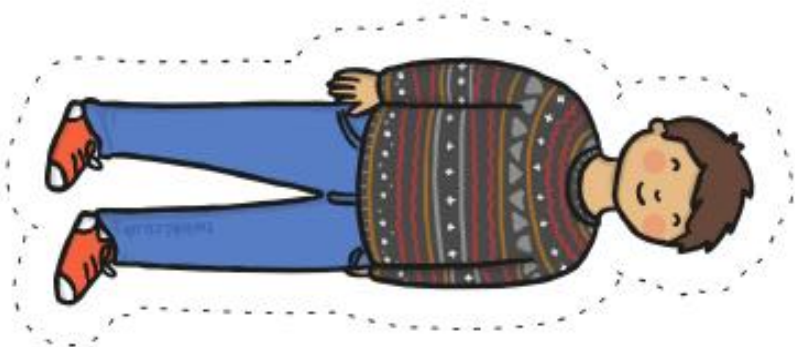
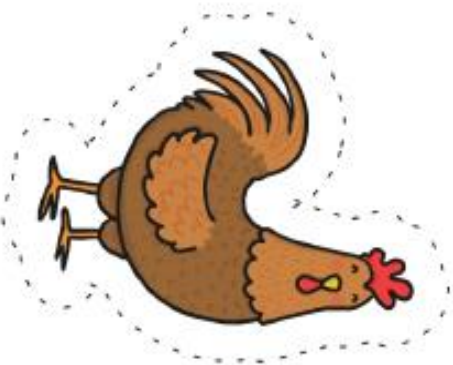
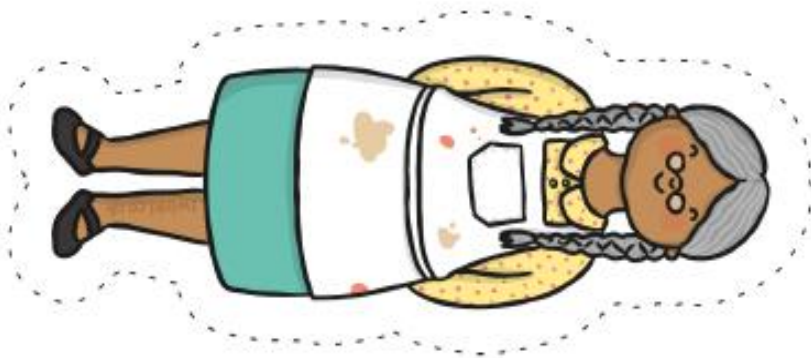
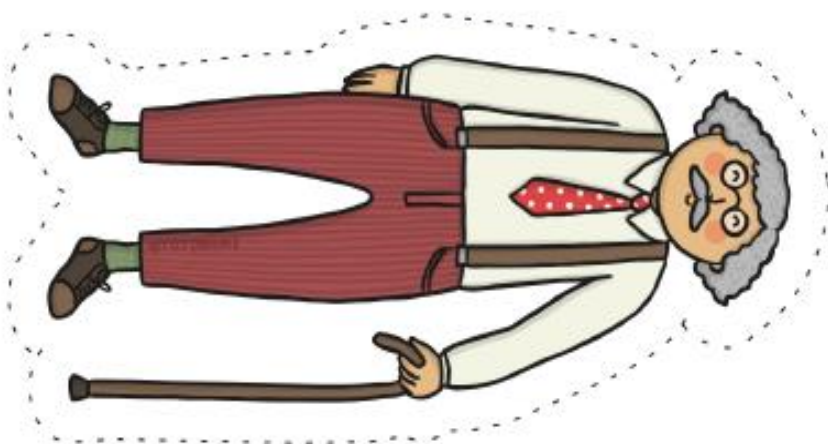
Story Map: The Gingerbread Man
