Wednesday – Phase 4 Read and Race. For this game, you need a dice and something to use for counters. Roll the dice, move your counter and then read the word. Who will be the first person to reach the finish?

Thursday – Play 'Treasure or Trash'. Sound out and blend the word. Is it a real word or a made up one? Put it in the treasure chest if it is real and in the bin if it is made up.

Friday – Handwriting and tricky words.

Try to make more of your letters smaller this week using the sheet provided. Can you still form them correctly?

Have a go at writing the tricky word 'little'. Can you use it in a sentence? Use the sheet in this pack to practise spelling our newest tricky words.


## Wind Science Experiment for Kids

- · Empty bottle
- Balloon
- · Bowl of hot water

Hot air rises and makes the wind blow around. Show kids exactly what happens with a simple wind experiment.

Put the balloon on top of the bottle and show them that the only thing inside is air. Set the bottle in a bowl of hot water and watch the balloon inflate as the air inside warms up.




















#### Talking Together


#### Play the game




Make your own milkshakes just like Oliver.
