Literacy/Speaking– First, choose an animal from the story. Next, think of some clues to describe the animal to someone in your house without telling them which one you have chosen. Can you have a go at writing the clues down? Can your family member guess which animal you chose from listening to or reading your clues. Have a look on Tapestry to try and work out which animal Mrs Cartwright and Miss Hall are describing.
