Dear the new Year 4,

A very warm welcome to year 4! As we have been unable to meet with you in person before the end of this school year we wanted to write to let you know that we are really excited about working with you in September and the year ahead. We have lots of fantastic things planned for you.

We look forward to seeing you in September and hearing about all the wonderful things you get up to.
